### **Disability Employment Services (DES) — Employment Support Service (ESS)**

#### **Melbourne**

The Commonwealth publishes outcomes by disability type for providers of Disability Employment Services (DES). The Employment Support Service (ESS) program helps job seekers with disability get a job, and provides ongoing support to keep a job.

Making an informed choice of provider makes a big difference in getting and keeping a job.

People with disability and their families can,

- Choose a provider
- Move to a different provider if they are not happy
- Look at past provider outcomes to make an informed choice

## **TABLE HEADINGS**

### **Job Placement (from March 2010)**

The proportion of participants that started with a provider, and got a job.

### **Job lasted for at least 52 weeks (from March 2013)**

The proportion of jobseekers that got a job which lasted for at least 52 weeks.

### **Indicative 52 weeks outcome**

The proportion of jobseekers that started with a provider, and got a job for at least 52 weeks.

**Note:** A “blank” (i.e., no numbers or rate) in a table means that a provider has achieved less than 20 outcomes.

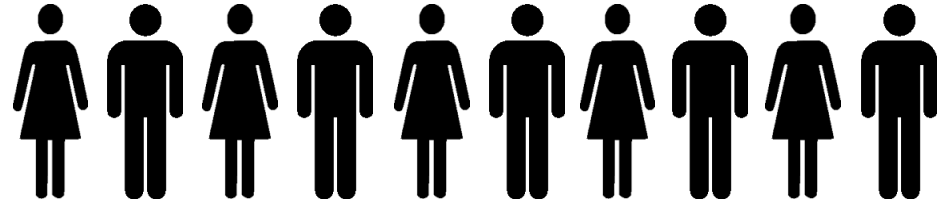

**10 people went to a provider**



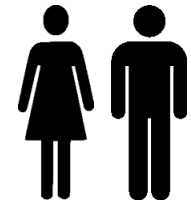
**4 people got a job**

- 4 out of 10 people got a job.  
A job placement rate of 40%



**2 people got a job that lasted for at least 52 weeks**

- 2 out of 4 people that got a job, kept their job for at least 52 weeks.  
A 52 week job sustainability rate of 50%
- 2 out of 10 people who started with a provider got a job that lasted for at least 52 weeks.  
An indicative 52 week outcome rate of 20%
