The proportion of jobseekers that started with a provider, and got a job for at least 52 weeks.

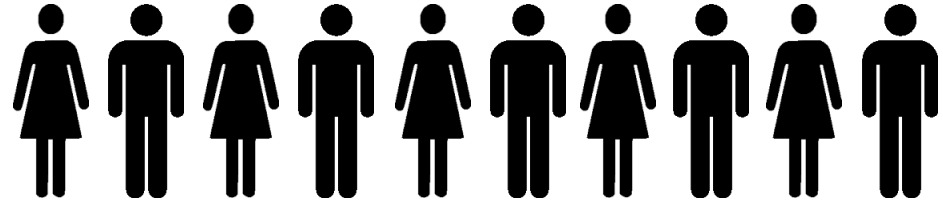
Note: A “blank” (i.e., no numbers or rate) in a table means that a provider has achieved less than 20 outcomes.

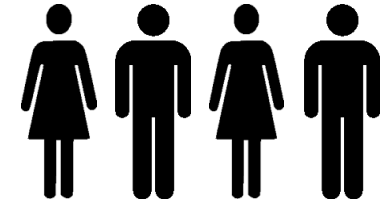
Example

10 people went to a provider



4 people got a job

- 4 out of 10 people got a job.
A job placement rate of 40%



2 people got a job that lasted for at least 52 weeks

- 2 out of 4 people that got a job, kept their job for at least 52 weeks.
A 52 week job sustainability rate of 50%
- 2 out of 10 people who started with a provider got a job that lasted for at least 52 weeks.
An indicative 52 week outcome rate of 20%
